





Did you know??

You can pay your bills on the go with our Mobile Banking App. Available in the Google Play Store and the Apple App Store, download it on your cell phone by searching "Touchbanking". Look for the blue and white icon, and after you open the new app, enter the App Code: FTSSBank1.

Important: This mobile app utilizes your existing User ID and Password for Internet Banking. The mobile app is just a convenient access method into your Internet Banking account, and anything done on one will affect the other.



Feature Story: Making a Homemade Wreath

Supplies you'll need:

- Christmas scrapbook paper cut into strips
- Christmas stickers
- White paper plates with the middle cut out to use as base of wreath
- Glue Sticks
- Tape
- Scissors
- Ribbon
- Bell or Christmas ornament to hang down from the top
- Hole punch



1. Glue the strips of scrapbook paper onto the circle of the paper plate however you want! You can use as little or as much as you desire. Use the stickers to decorate, too.

2. When you're done decorating with the paper and the stickers, have a parent punch a hole in the top of the wreath. Use the string to tie on a bell or ornament so that it hangs from the middle of the wreath.

3. Also, use the ribbon to tape a loop on the back of the wreath so you can hang it up on display. (See examples below for decorating ideas!)
